Moisson Estrie: In the past five years, the number of organisations to which the local food bank redistributes food has practically doubled, from 18 to 32, as well as 5 schools. On average 4,000 people receive food from these groups each month; 75% are on welfare (families, single parent families headed by women, immigrants, young men and seniors). Requests to Moisson Estrie for assistance increased by 25% in 2014/5 and another 10% this year. It's estimated 8% of Quebecers need help to meet their food needs.
