**Agriculture And Pesticides:** Dr. Marc Bélisle of the Biology Department at Université de Sherbrooke will speak at the next meeting of the St. Francis Valley Naturalists' Club, on February 28 at 7 p.m. He will present the results of studies designed to identify the impact of agricultural land use, prey availability and contamination by pesticides on the life of tree swallows. **Income tax clinics:** Yes, that time of year is coming around again. If you in a low-income tax bracket, two organizations offer inexpensive tax preparation services. Solutions Budget Plus is

located at 79 Wellington St. N., Suite 100, in downtown Sherbrooke, open Monday to Saturday starting in March. The cost is \$10 (cash) per person, and you can check your eligibility by calling 819.562.8656. Townshippers' Association is NO LONGER offering a clinic; instead, the service is being moved to Literacy In Action. This English-language community group is also located in Lennoxville, at 7 Connelly St. (J1M 1L8). They will be ready to meet with you as of March 12, and ask that people wait until then to give them a call for information, at 819-346-7009.

## Outreach

**Mitten tree:** Until Palm Sunday, hang your donated Hats, Underwear, Gloves and Socks/Scarves (or HUGS) on our tree. Toothbrushes and soap are also welcome! Mental Health Estrie prepares festive HUGS packages for homeless people, mostly adult men.

**Moisson Estrie:** There are boxes marked for the Moisson Estrie food bank at the front and back of the sanctuary. Please especially consider donating macaroni, spaghetti, flour, sugar, oil, peanut butter, canned fruit and vegetables.

Where do our donations go?

Food baskets: \$3 million worth of food to 30 organisations and 12 elementary schools; this represents 60 families per day!

Job training: Three work areas employ, for 26 weeks at a time, people who are trying to get back into the workforce.

Organisations assisted: Food banks in Asbestos, Coaticook, Cookshire, Lac Mégantic, Magog, Stanstead and Valcourt; popular eating places, e.g. La Chaudronnée and La Grande Table; community groups such as Le Journal de rue, Salvation Army, Centres pour femmes immigrantes...
